

# GPS spoofing, jamming on rise, IATA warns pilots to stay alert

PILOTS CAUTIONED AS GNSS INTERFERENCE SPREADS



## CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Indian airports including Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Amritsar have reported incidents
- GPS loss rate rose from 31 incidents per 1,000 flights in 2022 to 56 in 2024, and is projected to reach 59 in 2025
- Data shows the increase is not linked to higher flight volumes but to more frequent interference events

Willie Walsh said incidents of GPS spoofing and jamming require pilots to be more vigilant in terms of operation, because the increase has been very significant. "It exists right across the world now", Global Positioning System (GPS)/ Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) spoofing and jamming refers to attempts to manipulate a user's navigation system by giving false signals.

International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) identifies GNSS spoofing as a form of International Radio Frequency Interference (RFI).

Nick Careen, Senior Vice President Operations, Safety and Security at IATA, said that in the beginning, such incidents were in the Middle East and then, with the Russian-Ukrainian conflict, it was happening in Eastern Europe.

"Now, there are incidents in India, in Asia, in Venezuela..." he said. Data from IATA showed the GPS loss rate measured as the number of GPS loss events per 1,000 flights is estimated to be at 59 in 2025 compared to 31 in 2022.

These figures are based on data compiled from the Flight Data eXchange (FDX), an aggregated de-identified database of flight data that is part of the Global Aviation Data Management (GADM) programme.

# B'desh summons Indian envoy over Hasina's remarks

## DHAKA

Bangladesh's Foreign Ministry on Sunday summoned Indian High Commissioner Pranay Verma to express its "serious concern" over the "incendiary statements" made by deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina, who is currently in India.

Hasina, 78, fled to India in August last year after her Awami League government was toppled in a violent student-led street protest and continues to stay there.

She was sentenced to death by a special tribunal last month after being convicted on charges of crimes against humanity. Bangladesh has been demanding her extradition.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs summoned the Indian High Commissioner today to convey the Government of Bangladesh's serious concern to the Government of India



for allowing fugitive Sheikh Hasina to continue to make incendiary statements calling upon her supporters to engage in terrorist activities in Bangladesh, aiming to thwart the upcoming parliamentary elections, a foreign office statement said.

Bangladesh reiterates its call for her expeditious extradition alongside former home minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal to face death sentences handed down by the special tribunal last month, it added.

# UK on high alert after attack at Jewish event in Sydney

London steps up synagogue security; PM Starmer calls Bondi Beach shooting 'sickening' terrorist act

## LONDON

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer condemned the terrorist attack at Bondi Beach in Sydney, Australia, as he confirmed increased vigilance around Jewish sites across the country on Sunday.

The attack in Sydney was earlier described by Australian authorities as a terrorist attack targeted at members of the Jewish community celebrating the holy festival of Hanukkah, or Chanukah, at the time of the shooting.

The Metropolitan Police in London issued a statement in solidarity soon after, reiterat-

entities and digital scams, officials said on Sunday.

After busting the racket in October, investigators unravelled a single, tightly coordinated syndicate that relied on an elaborate digital and financial infrastructure to run a range of frauds. These included misleading loan applications, fake investment schemes, Ponzi and mul-

ti-level marketing models, bogus part-time job offers and fraudulent online gaming platforms.

According to the probe agency's final report, the group layered the flow of illicit funds through 111 shell companies, routing about Rs 1
