

HDFC Bank sets up blood storage unit in at Gramin Rugnalaya, Lasalgaon - Dist Nashik, Maharashtra

- ***First of its kind initiative by the Bank in Lasalgaon Dist Nashik.***
- ***More such facilities to open for supporting blood-deficient rural India***

Nashik (Maharashtra), February 23, 2019: In a first-of-its-kind initiative, HDFC Bank has set up a Blood Storage Unit in Lasalgaon – Dist Nashik, Maharashtra to help meet the rising scarcity of blood. This initiative is a part of the Bank's efforts to help support the blood-deficient rural areas in the country. Nashik will now have a new blood storage unit operating out of the Gramin Rugnalay (Civil Hospital), Lasalgaon. This unit will have a storage capacity of 50 bags which will help to save lives and also reduce the time taken for procuring blood.

HDFC Bank has been active in the blood donation space and holds the world's largest single-day Blood Donation Drive. It has been raising awareness about the scarcity of blood in the country by organizing donation drives since 2007. During these initiatives, it was observed that rural areas do not have the necessary access to large blood banks for meeting their blood requirements. Most blood banks are situated in faraway places and results in delays while receiving blood, especially during emergencies. To enable this, the Bank has helped to set up storage facilities across the following centres of the country:

The unit will have a limited storage capacity when compared with a blood bank, but will be essential for Nashik citizens during unforeseen emergencies.
