HDFC Bank Parivartan to skill 720 women in nursing in Jharkhand

- Kaushal College launched in the state of Jharkhand
- Almost 16,000 households in the state impacted via the #Parivartan programme

Ranchi (Jharkhand), March 1, 2019: HDFC Bank launched a programme to skill 720 women in nursing through state-of-the-art Kaushal Colleges in Jharkhand. One Kaushal College is already running successfully in Chanho, catering to 120 young women at present. Another Kaushal College in Jharkhand was inaugurated today in Ranchi by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Jharkhand Shri Raghubar Das. This Kaushal College will offer certificate courses in various trade to the candidates.

Kaushal Colleges are run by the PanIIT Alumni Reach for Jharkhand Foundation (PreJha Foundation), a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) of the Department of Welfare, Government of Jharkhand in partnership with PanIIT Alumni Reach for India Foundation. Under this initiative, HDFC Bank offers assistance to the candidates through its merit-based scholarships, educational-loan interest subvention and providing programmatic support to enable financial inclusion and vocational education for nursing courses. HDFC Bank is supporting three Kaushal Colleges in the state of Jharkhand including those in Gumla district, Ranchi district (Chanho) and Saraiekela district (Rajnagar) for next 2 years. Kaushal Colleges across Jharkhand aim to train and place 720 beneficiaries from affirmative action sections including SC, ST, OBC and other poor youth hailing from naxal-affected districts across the state of Jharkhand by year 2020.

The event was attended by dignitaries including the Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Tribal Affairs, Shri Sudarshan Bhagat; Hon'ble Minister of Welfare – Jharkhand, Dr. Louis Marandi; Hon'ble Minister of Urban Development, Housing & Transport Department, Jharkhand, Shri. C.P. Singh; Hon'ble Minister of Labour, Employment & Training, Jharkhand, Shri Raj Paliwar; Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Shri Ram Tahal Choudhary; Mr. Katsuo Matsumoto, Chief Representative of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) India Office; Ms. Nusrat Pathan, Head CSR, HDFC Bank; and Chef Manjit Singh Gill, President Indian Federation of Culinary Associations (IFCA), and Chef Sounder, Secretary IFCA, were also present amongst the dignitaries.

This new college is part of Parivartan – our initiative to bring about sustainable development through interventions at multiple levels, foremost being equipping the youth of the state to find their way out of vicious cycle of poverty through education and employable skills."

IFCA is providing support in curriculum, faculty development, expert visits, certification and placements. The manufacturing technician course is predicated on WorldSkills curriculum that with advanced
